OMRRA NOVICE LICENSING INFORMATION

***NRS = Novice Racer School

To all who wish to obtain an OMRRA racing license:

- 1) Sign up with an OMRRA approved NRS provider. These providers can be found at www.omrra.com
- 2) After signing up with the track day organization, complete the following: Go to the OMRRA website (www.omrra.com) and fill out a Membership Application and an online Medical Form (if you haven't done so already). Send or fax in your Membership Application with the \$85 fee included. If you have sent in your form already but not included payment, please do so ASAP.
- 3) Fill out a pre-entry form for the weekend you will do your first Novice race. Send or fax your Pre-Entry form in with the appropriate fees.
- 4) Upon passing the NRS successfully, you will be given a certificate of completion. In order to participate in the Saturday morning check ride, you must complete the following additional requirements: Graduates must attend the OMRRA NLP (Novice Licensing Program) Orientation meeting. Orientation meetings will be held on Thursday April 9th, Friday May 29th, and Friday July 24th. They will be held in the Pro Pit Tower, on the 3rd floor. Class time is from 6:00 pm - 7:30 pm.
*Graduates must also pass with a 100% score on the Novice Test. This test must be turned into the Head Novice Instructor and VERIFIED BEFORE your check ride. The earlier the better. These can be downloaded from www.omrra.com, and faxed to 503-439-6279, or sent to the OMRRA office at 7420 SW 77th Ave, Portland, OR 97223, or scanned and sent to Jmlbike@aol.com.
*You are automatically signed up for the first check ride available following your successful NRS completion.
- 5) In the event that you do not pass the track day Novice School, your paid fees will remain on file with OMRRA until you do receive a passing certificate, or fees may be refunded by request.
- 6) In the event that you do not meet the check ride requirements on Saturday morning, you will need to attempt to pass again on a future Saturday morning, and pay an additional \$50. You are not required to take another track day Novice School if you successfully completed it, but failed the check ride.
- 7) You must complete your check ride for your Novice License on the same bike that you received your successful completion certificate from at the track day Novice School.
- 8) Curriculum packets, test, and forms will be available on the website within 2 weeks.

- 9) You are not required to take the OMRRA Novice License test even after successfully completing the track day Novice School; you may just take the track day Novice School for experience only.
- 10) OMRRA requires that you use AMB, which is our form of electronic scoring. You may rent or buy one from Tom Young at Competition Motors. compmotors@comcast.net or 503-320-2475. You may also contact info@cascadetracktime.com to inquire about renting or purchase. Novices are NOT allowed to borrow another racers AMB for use during OMRRA events.
- 11) Your Bike/Competition number is listed on the front of your mailing packet. If you race a 600, 750, Open, or Open Twins bike, you will race in the NV4/NV5 grid. If your bikes falls into any other category you will race in the "Expert" grid of your bikes primary class. You may choose to race a second class, using the migration chart in the rulebook to determine which class is the "step up" class for your motorcycle. Two race classes are the maximum until graduation. ALL novices are required to wear a green t-shirt (provided). Pay close attention to the detailed schedule on our website.
- 12) It is YOUR responsibility to read and KNOW the rulebook.
- 13) All Novices will keep track of their volunteer time, have it verified, and turn it in on a timely basis before being granted a "Graduated Novice" license.

INFORMATION ON THE 85CC AND UNDER 13 YEAR OLD CLASS:

Two 85cc/Under 13 year old Classes will be held by OMRRA in 2009. These will be at the April 10th and May 30th race weekends.

- 1) Follow all the instructions previous regarding filling out of Membership, Medical, and Pre-Entry Forms, as well as payment thereof.
- 2) Fees are \$235 = \$100 for All Day Practice, \$135 for your first race.
- 3) The Thursday evening prior to your first race weekend (April 8th and May 28th) you will attend a 90 minute classroom session at PIR. This session is on the 3rd floor of the inside Pro Pit Tower.
- 4) Saturday (or Friday in April) you will complete a full day Novice School with OMRRA, as well as take and pass the written test provided by OMRRA.
- 5) Upon successful completion of both of these, you will be granted a Novice license for racing the following day.
