OMRRA Members:

Here's hoping you all spent the recent Days of Ice and Snow doing nothing but oil changes, coolant flushes, placing sponsor stickers, and imagining sunny days at PIR. The wait is killin' me!

But, we can see the 2017 OMRRA season from here. Step 1 is definitely to get your Membership and Med Form into the OMRRA office, so Indy can help you keep your race number. Step 2 is to target a "vulnerable" friend, and bring him or her to one of our upcoming New Racer Workshops. And Step 3 is to come on out to the Portland Motorcycle Film Festival, an OMRRA Air Fence Fundraiser, on January 27-28. (aka "bales") of Airfence (soft barriers) to 3 locations at PIR each event weekend. The Airfence is stored in shipping containers on the PIR property, and is moved to and from their deployment positions on an OMRRA owned 20' flatbed trailer.

Typically requires 2 or more independent contractors and one vehicle capable of towing the 4000# trailer (loaded). Estimated at 18-20 man hours, Thurs pm through Sun pm. \$1000 per weekend.

OMRRA & WMRRA Hosted Round

OMRRA has enjoyed hosting WMRRA at PIR the past two years. There have been questions asked by OMRRA Membership about the lack of a hosted round in 2017. This attempts to answer the primary questions. The OMRRA Board remains optimistic about a hosted round in 2018.

Why isn't there a hosted round in 2017 at PIR?

- OMRRA formally asked the WMRRA Board to align 2017 schedules, avoid conflicting weekends and participate in a 2017 hosted round at PIR, with initial and repeated outreach from OMRRA beginning July 2016, via email, phone and in person.
- WMRRA decided not to schedule a hosted round at PIR with OMRRA on Jan. 12, 2016.

Why isn't there a hosted round in 2017 in Washington?

- WMRRA did not formally present an option for a combined or hosted round in Washington to the OMRRA board.
- To be considered, a proposal must be received well before the annual scheduling process with PIR. OMRRA requests track dates for the following

After 4 years, the Film Festival has raised over \$50,000 for Air Fence and safety gear purchase and deployment at OMRRA events. Thanks to all who bought tickets – shows are sold out, so we'll see you there.

The 2017 race schedule is published, with New Racer School and chicane dates chosen. Unfortunately, due to schedule challenges and shifting priorities, WMRRA has chosen not to join OMRRA for a combined round at one of our events this season. I'm disappointed, since they were our largest events the past two years, and we'll miss seeing the Washington crew here as a group. But...look for other interesting midseason special events. The gap is a challenge and an opportunity to create something new. More to come on that.

We'll be sharing more about those plans for the season, and soliciting ideas for ongoing improvements to our Association, at the February General Membership Meeting. Come on out, bring your questions and ideas for the Board, and be part of the process.

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

The general membership meeting will be at Ringlers Pub on February 21st starting at 7:00 season by the end of August, and PIR assembles its provisionary schedule in September. OMRRA's provisionary schedule was sent to WMRRA and AFM to help avoid conflicts, as there is still some flexibility through October. Typically other clubs send their proposed dates to OMRRA for the same purpose. The schedule is firm by November.

- When informally asked by WMRRA members, the OMRRA Board has remained open to the possibility of going to the Ridge.
- A Ridge event would almost certainly mean a 7th round for OMRRA. Once dates are given up at PIR, OMRRA risks losing first right of refusal (not being able to get dates back the following season). The permanent loss of a date would limit OMRRA's ability to thrive in the future. The OMRRA Board would need to have a conversation with the General Membership about support for a 7th round.

What is the difference between a "Combined" round and a "Hosted" round?

- Hosted means the race event is entirely organized and operated by the Host Club including track rental, insurance, registration, timing and scoring, staffing and administration. At the 2015 and 2016 OMRRA events, WMRRA attendees were guests, as were riders from AFM or elsewhere.
- A "combined" event would mean two clubs splitting management, cost, labor, and financial risk/reward to run an event. Due to the complexity of equitably splitting all those, to-date OMRRA has not designed or offered such an arrangement, nor has OMRRA received such a proposal. For the sake of simplicity, the hosted format has worked well.

Has OMRRA given money to WMRRA for the 2015 or 2016 hosted rounds?

In 2015, with no past experience as a

guide, no money was requested or exchanged. WMRRA asked OMRRA to host a date that season after they'd only scheduled five race weekends that year.

- OMRRA offered and paid WMRRA \$5,000 following their return visit in 2016. That calculation was made following the event based on a percentage of profits after expenses were paid.
- OMRRA increased the financial offer to WMRRA for 2017, with incentives to elevate rider attendance, that could have paid \$7,500-\$10,000.

Why was WMRRA paid in 2016?

 The second event was as financially successful as the first. Payment was both an acknowledgement of the contribution WMRRA racers made to the bottom line, and to lay the groundwork for future reciprocation. It was a sound business decision, and in short, OMRRA thought it was fair.

Who bears the costs of a Hosted round at PIR?

- OMRRA bears the costs including track rental, insurance, and staffing. WMRRA would similarly bear the costs for OMRRA to attend a round in Washington. Some generous WMRRA volunteers asked if they could help in 2015 and 2016. Their hotel rooms were paid for by OMRRA, and they received the same food, drink, and warm thanks that OMRRA's volunteers receive. OMRRA did not require WMRRA volunteers to help.
- If WMRRA incurred other costs, those are not known to OMRRA.
